

Development of Special Interest Groups (SIGs)

SALTS successfully re-established Special Interest Groups (SIGs) in 2024, with SIGs formed around the topics of voice, dysphagia, and communication (see below for details). Each SIG provided valuable opportunities for professional networking, fostering shared learning experiences, and deepening collective expertise. Speech Therapists (STs) across various settings came together to exchange knowledge, discuss clinical practices, and shape the future direction of our profession. This highlighted the enthusiasm on the ground for continual learning and collaboration.

Voice

10th May | Topic: Van Stan's Taxonomy of Voice Therapy. Facilitated by Mr. Joel Tay and Ms. Chia Ting Hui, the session sparked engaging discussions and provided participants with fresh perspectives on voice therapy approaches.

18th Oct | Topic: Transgender Voice Therapy. It was a supportive space for STs to share experiences, discuss best practices, and break down barriers in inclusive voice therapy. The session reinforced the value of community and collaboration in advancing practice.



SALTS is committed to supporting SIGs as vital platforms for professional development, interdisciplinary discussions, and advocacy efforts. We look forward to supporting SIGs on the above-mentioned topics as well as Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) in 2025. Updates will be provided regularly through SALTS' social media platforms. We welcome all STs to join us in shaping future SIG sessions and ensuring that our profession continues to grow together!

SpeechieBites (Student Outreach)

In 2024, SpeechieBites, the student outreach arm of SALTS, organised talks related to the theme **"The Unwinding Journey of Speech Therapy"**. The theme was selected as one which most students or past participants expressed consistent interest. As the first batch of ST students graduated from the Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT), their immediate concerns were in trying to understand the path that lay ahead.



SpeechieBites talks were arranged to bring the participants along a charted growth in the profession. We started the year off with '*Entering The Realm*' which explored how to navigate both career and student ST spaces in the early stages. Having a panel of fresh graduates alongside senior STs who were in the hiring process helped create room for discussion around what it takes to thrive in academics and secure employment.

The second talk, '*Navigating Spaces*', welcomed experienced STs with chosen specialisations, who shared their clinical and career insights.

The final talk of the year was '*Exploring Endless Opportunities*', which saw a mix of practising and non-practising STs now pursuing interests outside of the Speech and Language Profession.

With a hybrid model for physical events, we saw consistent sign-ups of 25 to 30 participants for each event, including students, working STs, members of the public considering a career switch, as well as university students from other courses.

In 2025, SpeechieBites hopes to focus more on developing mentoring within the profession whilst still continuing to organise talks that are relevant to the ST student community.

Healthcare Professional Community (HPC)

2024 Job And Career Satisfaction Survey

In 2024, SALTS conducted an inaugural survey on career satisfaction among STs in Singapore. The survey aimed to explore job motivation, workplace challenges, and factors influencing retention and attrition in a field where rising service demands are met with ongoing workforce shortages. Open to all AHPC-registered STs, including those who had left the profession, the survey gathered insights from 269 respondents across diverse demographics and practice settings. Findings from this survey were presented at the Annual General Meeting in March 2025.

Speech Therapy Week 2024

With a theme of '**Celebrating Differences**', the SALTS committee organised a movie screening and fireside chat with Sabi, a young woman with autism, her mother Komathi, and sister Trish on 7th November 2024. It was an insightful evening filled with heartfelt sharing from all. 

SALTS has a total of **75** members as of February 2025, a decline since March 2024 (120 members). There has been an overall decline in memberships, despite the consistent take-up rate at SALTS events.

This mismatch could be attributed to SALTS events being open to both members and non-members (sometimes free, otherwise for a small fee), while membership benefits are not sufficiently appealing to STs on the ground.

Meanwhile, student memberships declined, while students have offered feedback that the Student Membership fee is too costly for them. The spike in student members in previous years can be attributed to free memberships issued at the time.



MEMBERSHIP

The current executive committee (exco) is committed to improving the SALTS membership benefits, and have begun exploring affiliations with regional and international organisations such as the Asian Dysphagia Society (ADS) and the Asia-Pacific Society of Speech, Language & Hearing (APSSLH).



In response to feedback from the ground, the exco has also proposed:

- New membership categories for newly-graduated STs and student STs, to make it more affordable and hence accessible to them.
- To combine the Overseas and Associate Membership categories, due to their small numbers.

These constitutional amendments were passed during AGM 2025.

The exco is also exploring lifestyle benefits with various local and international companies and brands to offer more appealing benefits to members. For 2025, some of these include promotional prices with Spa Esprit Group (Browhaus / Strip), Q&M Dental, Kindlespace, and KristenKiong.com.




Some examples of brands that will offer lifestyle benefits for SALTS members beginning in 2025.

WEBSITE STATISTICS

Traffic on the SALTS website has increased compared to the previous year. There were a total of 30,021 page views on the SALTS website from March 2024 to February 2025. This would be an average of 2,309 per month, with 13,484 site sessions (average of 1,039 per month). There were 8,745 unique visitors, an average of 773 per month, mostly from Singapore, followed by Malaysia, and Australia.



Sessions by country:



The top viewed pages were the *Homepage*, *Becoming an SLT*, and *Observations*, which suggests interest from prospective ST students. This was followed by *Upcoming Events*, which indicates interest from practising STs exploring SALTS events.

The top referral sources were Google searches (6,309) and direct access (i.e. users typing in the SALTS website URL; 4,669), followed by referrals from the Malaysian Association of Speech-Language & Hearing (MASH) website, National University of Singapore Medicine and the SALTS Facebook page.

In general, there has been an increase in visits to the SALTS website compared to the year before, a positive sign that many visitors are relying on SALTS for information and events.


In the period of March 2024 to Feb 2025, the total views were 49,111 on Instagram and 34,701 on Facebook. The number of followers on Instagram increased from 118 to 444, and from 1,557 to 1,598 on Facebook. The student outreach Instagram account (@speechie.bites) also saw in increase in followers, from 462 to 569.

The social media team decided to deactivate the X (Twitter) account in early 2025, due to lack of use and engagement on the platform since 2023.









SALTS Insider

SALTS Insider is our long-form social media content, housed within the SALTS website and launched in 2022 (https://www.salts.org.sg/salts-insider). Since 2023, there have been 16 posts published, covering announcements for the profession, annual messages from SALTS president, and features on ST patients, initiatives, clinical work and specialisation.

Since its inception, there has been noticeably better engagement with features of initiatives or individuals rather than announcements. The team will explore pursuing more features in the coming year.

Over the past year, there were 747 post views from 501 unique visitors. Most of the visitors entered through Google searches or by browsing the SALTS website.




FINANCIAL STATEMENTS



Comparing FY2023 to FY2024, the majority of increase in revenue (+44%) earned from workshops can be attributed to the increase in the number of workshops organised or hosted by SALTS.

There was an increase in expenditure (+30%) due to more activities that incurred increased fees:

- More events hosted by SALTS,
- Increase in affliations requiring membership fees, and
- Training for more committee members.
